

SOC GOES TO CHICAGO

The City of **Big Shoulders...** and **Saabs**



What better way to tie in the **40**th **Saab Owners Convention** (the first **SOC** was held in Illinois!) than being in Chicago? In the center of the country? The Windy City! Home of the Chicago Style Hotdog! The Second City! This year's SOC will be held in Oak Brook, a suburb in DuPage County and some 20 miles west of downtown Chicago. Oak Brook is close enough to be able to jump onto any highway and be in downtown Chicago in a matter of minutes (outside of rush hour) or drive in the opposite direction and visit different forest preserves, museums, activities, ect. Best of the city, best of the country.

There's a ton to do in and around Chicagoland:

THE LAKE IS BIG:

Chicago is on the shores of Lake Michigan. We are often called the 3rd Coast and if you've seen any of the Great Lakes you know why. Careful where you park your Saab because the Great Lakes are big enough to be tidal. There are several river cruises to choose from, but there's a special one, the Chicago Architectural Boat Tours for great background on the city and the evolution of modern architecture. There's also a tall, masted ship – Tall Ship Windy – which sails from Navy Pier. And the Riverwalk has a plethora of restaurants, views and plenty of parking adjacent for a great downtown Chicago excursion.

FROM THE TOP DOWN:

Chicago is where the skyscraper was born, and there are a few buildings where you can get a bird's eye view

of the city. The Willis Tower (we still call it the Sears Tower) Skydeck is super-fun and takes you up to the highest view in the city. The John Hancock Building also offers a view but has the option of a meal or drinks at the Signature Room. There are also plenty of rooftop bars and eagle's nest views, such as the Chicago Athletic Club and the London House.

ART AND CULTURE:

Chicago has some fantastic cultural hot-spots. The Art Institute of Chicago boasts a collection equal to any museum in the world, and its permanent collection includes masterpieces from Edward Hopper to Georgia O'Keeffe to the Impressionists. Millenium Park with the iconic sculpture "Cloud Gate" (better known as the Bean) can be day unto itself. Near Millenium Park (and next to each other) are the Field Museum, Shedd Aquarium, and Adler Planetarium, each of which is world-class. The Field Museum in particular is a must-see for any Chicago visitor.

INDUSTRIAL OPPORTUNITIES:

The Museum of Science and Industry is housed in the only remaining large hall from the 1893 World's Fair. Its collection includes a German U-Boat, the California Zephyr and a massive collection of trains, planes and other transport. The University of Chicago and several other fantastic institutions like the Smart Museum of Art and the Oriental Institute are located in and around Hyde Park.



EVENTS FOR SOC:

There will be a track day event at the Autobahn Country Club on Wednesday, July 19, with lunch included and an opportunity to drive your car around the track. There is a go-kart track on the premises and we are hoping to have a special competition with trophies for those who participate. Petersen Automotive will be on hand to lend

a helping hand in case of the unforeseeable misfortune of something happening to your Saab.

On Thursday, July 20, the first official day of SOC, we have some special events planned. First is a scenic drive down some of old Route 66 towards Joliet, including a stop at the old Joliet Correctional Center (most famously depicted in the movie "The Blues Brothers"). Later we will do a Saab takeover at a local car show/cruise night in beautiful downtown Westmont. Westmont's Cruise Night is a short 10 minute drive from the hotel and it includes a whole street festival. Cruise Night is a fun event that easily attracts 300 cars.

During SOC there will also be a Saab Scavenger Hunt. Participants will be given sheets with a series of clues and questions to fill out during the show that are related to Saabs. Learn more about the Saab brand and have a blast meeting new people to socialize with.

To paraphrase "Ferris Bueller's Day Off" (a famous Chicago movie): "Life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop and look around once in a while, you could miss it." So don't miss **SOC 2023** – come to Chicago and see some great cars in one of the world's great cities.

CAPTAINS OF DESIGN:

Chicago was built on architectural design and engineering. From floating foundations, steel reinforced concrete, and steel superstructures, Chicago was a pioneer in creating the modern cityscape as we know it. The place to start an architectural tour of Chicago is the CAC, the Chicago Architecture Center. The CAC has tours, self-guided, and maps, all for a fantastic glimpse into the amazing architecture that still stands in this city. A quick tour to Federal Plaza will put you in reach of historic buildings designed by Louis Sullivan and Ludwig Mies van der Rohe. And don't miss the most interesting building in the county, the Monadnock Building.

FROM DuSABLE TO THE BLUES:

We are a city of immigrants. We celebrate our founding fathers (and subsequent generations of later African Americans) at the DuSable Museum of African American History - also located near the Museum of Science and Industry. The two make a great day in Hyde Park. We are a proudly integrated city with our own Blues and Jazz sounds. For Blues and Jazz, the best places are Blue Chicago, Buddy Guy's, the Kingston Mines, Andy's and the Green Mill. Do not miss the music!

WAY BEFORE THE SWEDES:

We are also still a city of the indigenous. Long before European settlers came to the Chicago region, it was home to the Ojibwe, Odawa, Potawatomi, and Miami, among others. The archeological evidence points to a little over 13,000 years of human occupation. You can see Chicago's indigenous past in glory and in brutal reality at the Mitchell Museum of the Native American and also at the Field Museum's new Native Lands permanent exhibit.

THE **SPYKER** SAGA

Dutchman has to buy Saab? That's pretty awkward, right? [That] in a country which is so renowned for its wonderful industries, for its engineering capabilities, that it required a Dutchman to save Saab from the brink of extinction?"

An inflamed Victor Muller, blue eyes bristling with a combination of anger and disappointment, speaks candidly with a Swedish interviewer about his attempt to confront the dire prognosis of a post-GM, pre-bankruptcy Saab and deliver the company from the cusp of collapse. This is the cold open to an hourlong documentary episode of Swedish Television's investigative program Uppdrag Granskning, in which a team of journalists work to piece together the story of Saab's existential struggle following the company's separation from General Motors. The program, which aired during October 2012 in Sweden (and which is mostly in Swedish but with English subtitles in the

version available online), portrays Muller as Saab's would-be savior, and as a man who fought tirelessly against long odds and the Swedish government's bureaucratic malaise in a protracted effort to rescue the iconic carmaker.

The full episode, "Spelet om Saab" ("The Saab Gamble"), is available on Marcus & Manuela's Saab Channel on YouTube.com. Uppdrag Granskning's journalists place blame on Swedish politicians for not doing enough to keep Saab afloat, especially in light of the US government's painfully ironic bailout of General Motors. But Saab's precarious financial situation and $\bar{\circ}$

habit for yearly operating losses were no secret to the Swedish government, who did not consider themselves to be in any position to run an automobile manufacturer.

Muller's rescue attempt came after a series of aborted deals to purchase Saab from GM after the global giant decided to spin-off Saab in the wake of the Great Recession. The story ended, after a scramble for suitable financing, with GM's refusal to allow Muller to enter into a partnership with financial backing from the Chinese auto industry, as GM was essentially unwilling to sell any of its intellectual property to China for fear that doing so would negatively impact competitive advantages and upset shareholders. Negotiations stalled and the Spyker saga ended in bankruptcy proceedings, although this did not constitute a final endpoint on the Saab timeline; there was still the long slog ahead with NEVS and various "investors," chronicled in real-time by this magazine's past NEVS News column. But Muller's pugnacious spirit and contagiously optimistic vision for Saab's future represented a final wave of hope for industry pundits and fans of the company that perhaps Saab could reclaim its long-faded position as a leading competitor amongst premium European cars.

What would Muller's Saab have looked like had it met with more favorable circumstances and prospered? The best clue we have may be the PhoeniX concept car from the 2011 Geneva Auto Show.

Muller recognized Saab's legacy of innovation in both design and technology, and part of his plan to resuscitate the brand involved bringing in an ex-Pininfarina designer, Jason Castriota, and partnering with BMW as an engine provider. Muller envisioned the PhoeniX as the best type of concept car: one that, while not intended for production, would showcase the path forward for future production models. Its design borrowed cues from Saab's past while also taking a bold new direction. *Car and Driver*, in their coverage of the 2011 Geneva show, had this to say about the high-tech underpinnings of the PhoeniX:

"Saab's new all-wheel-drive system, which is dubbed eXWD—and which explains the capitalized X in the car's name—was developed jointly with American Axle.

Power for the front wheels comes from a transversely mounted, turbocharged and direct-injected 1.6-liter four-banger from the BMW/Mini cache.... The PhoeniX rides on the platform that will underpin the next-gen 9-3 (perhaps called 93), although the company hasn't disclosed whether it's an evolution of the car's current structure, a loaner from the BMW bin, or something else altogether."

The gas engine in the PhoeniX reportedly produced 200hp and 184lb-ft of torque (199lb-ft with temporary overboost) and coupled to a six-speed manual transmission. While it drove only the front wheels, *Car and Driver* noted that, "the rear wheels also put power to pavement, courtesy of a 34-hp electric motor and a 1.1-kWh lithium-ion battery pack; Saab claims this setup enables 'a touch' of torque vectoring."

The magazine gently accused the PhoeniX of playing "buzzword bingo" to generate hype, with its hybrid drivetrain and turbocharged, direct-injected motor (not to mention the heavy-handed name). But Saab, with its vast knowledge of turbocharging and past partnership with Haldex, was already on track to be a tech and engineering leader well before the Spyker deal. They just needed the working capital to realize their potential, and Muller knew that bringing in outside engine and drivetrain technology partners, especially from leading innovators like BMW, would help control costs.

Under Mulller's leadership, Saab worked to develop a new-gen 9-3, with technology and styling derived from the PhoeniX, to supplement the 9-4x and new-gen 9-5 already in the model line-up. But financial troubles continued to mount, with Saab at times unable to pay staff and suppliers. Then, one week before Christmas 2011, the carmaker's 3,500 employees abruptly found themselves out of work. Saab had gone bankrupt.

Post-bankruptcy, Saab struggled to reorganize itself and resume production over the course of several years, but the company and its NEVS successor never recaptured the optimism, confidence, and swagger that Muller brought to the ailing firm.

ENDLESS **SAABS**

The 8th annual **Endless Mountain Vintage Saab Jamboree** will be held Friday and Saturday, June 9 - 10, 2023, and as always it is sponsored by Don Snedeker and hosted on Don's property near Clifford (58 Snedeker Rd, Clifford, PA 18470). The Jamboree is the one of the largest (or maybe even the largest) vintage Saab gatherings in the United States. Attendees are mainly from the Northeastern U.S. but have also come from other places, including Canada, California, Kansas, Michigan, Ohio, New York, Virginia, and Maryland.

Historically, there have been about fifty vintage Saabs registered for the event, including different gas and two-stroke models of Saab 92, 93, 96, 95, 97 (Sonett), 99, and recently 900s. Cars are present in different stages of development, restoration, and/or originality. The Jamboree car count does not take into consideration newer Saabs that are used for transportation to the Event but don't register, so the actual number of Saabs in attendance is quite high.

Regular hotel accommodations are available within a reasonable distance. Camping is also available on site in tents, cars, RVs, and trailers. A drive-about is usually planned for Friday afternoon, while Friday night dinner is informally coordinated with attendees convoying to Bingham's Family Restaurant for good homemade food and conversation. Local food trucks provide sustenance on Saturday.

Scheduled and spontaneous tech sessions are conducted over the course of the Jamboree. Saab part sales are permitted. On Saturday morning attendee vintage voting is conducted for People's Choice, Best in Show, Diamond in the Rough, Most Original, Most Modified, with Honorable Mention for Longest Distance Traveled. Awards are presented in the afternoon. Last year a special award was presented to Zakk Snedeker for his participation in the planning, coordination, and attention to the **Endless Mountain Vintage Saab Jamboree**.

The **Saab Club of Arizona** (**SCAZ**) held its annual gathering at IMM Auto Service in Tempe, Arizona, last November. With sunny skies and 70 degrees the Arizona winter is the best time of year for Saab events in the desert. Cars ranged from a 400,000+ mile Concours-quality Sonett III from northern Arizona, to modified GM era Saabs, such as a **SOC 2022** People's Choice Award winning 550hp 9-5, and everything in between. This is the third time the annual SCAZ meet has been held at IMM, which has been supporting the Arizona and Phoenix metro area Saab community for years as the go-to Saab shop for repairs and service. SCAZ also hosts a wide variety of informal events outside of the annual meet. 





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END OF AN ERA

Very few people can say they had the same job for 53 years. In 1964 when I was 11, my father, Ken, presented me with an opportunity of a lifetime which at the time I didn't understand. He sold his pie bakery and immediately got into the automotive industry partnering with Florian Schmidt to form Schmidt's Body Shop. Dad was mechanical since he needed to keep his fleet of three delivery trucks serviced. I remember on weekends Dad would have me around cleaning brake shoes, adding oil to the engine after an oil change, and just being

around him. Dad was a good front man with great character. My mother, Clara, was a secretary for Montgomery Wards. Florian was a talented craftsman repairing damaged cars. Dad and mom did all the front-end work, writing estimates and drumming up new business. Florian was in charge of production. They were quite a team!

Our connection with Saab happened in 1964. Dad had the contracts for AVIS & Hertz rental cars to repair their damaged rentals at Stapleton Airport in Denver, Colorado. Driving down Smith Road north of the airport, Dad noticed a warehouse unloading Saabs from train cars. He stopped in and met Dick Catron, introduced himself and asked him if there were any cars that got damaged in transport that needed to be repaired prior to sale. Dick had two cars with damage. Dad took them, repaired them, and returned them to Dick. Dick was impressed with the quality and Schmidt's Body Shop became Dick's go-to choice for collision repair. Dick also had a retail dealership on south Broadway, "Saab Denver", which also opened in 1964.

The partnership ended in 1969 and Dad formed **Mile Hi Body Shop**. Dad found a small three-car garage for rent. Two technicians, customers and the Saab account followed Dad. Mile Hi Body Shop was Saab Denver's recommended collision repair facility. Damaged 96's & 99's were towed in, some were fixable and some were totaled. Mile Hi Body

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Without Saab in my life, I am sure it would be different. Saab brings us all together as a huge family.

Shop bought the cars for parts and was known as a "Junk Yard" for Saab parts. We bought cars, repaired and sold them. Prior to sale, we sent our cars to a small independent to get serviced prior to sale.

I was always mechanical. Nothing was cooler than having your father own an automotive garage. I learned to weld when I was 11. I rebuilt my first '66 GTO V-8 engine for a friend and finished it before I turned 16. I graduated High School in 1971.

The opportunity my father presented to me when I was 11 was now starting to make sense. In 1978 Mile Hi Body Shop incorporated. Dad asked me what my focus on life was. I loved the shop and wanted to stay. In 1978 Dad made me the president at age 25. The shop was strictly collision repair. Most of our work was Saabs. In 1978, I decided to do our own mechanical repairs instead of farming it out. That created a big problem. For collision work you'd likely have two cars a week, but for mechanical repairs you can have three cars a day. We immediately outgrew the small shop.

In 1982 we purchased half of a city block with a 15,000 sq.ft. building on it in Denver's industrial district, which we used to expand our service, salvage yard and to relocate our collision services. Saabs were popular in Denver. The height of our business was between 1990

and 1999. We had 17 employees. Because of our used parts, there were 7 other independents in Denver. Mile Hi serviced them with the large selection of used parts we collected. We got along great with everybody including our supporting dealer Mike Shaw Saab.

Life was good for me. Even to the day I closed Mile Hi, April 30, 2021, I really enjoyed what I did. Owning a large business for me was not a burden. I very rarely thought to myself "I really do not want to be here today." I loved my customers and employees. My son Jerrime and daughter Michelle played a valuable part. When I closed the business, all I wanted to accomplish was not to be a business owner anymore. At 67, I did not want to be 80 and still running a business. Time to change my routine. I purchased two "Man Cave Warehouses" close to my house after I sold the property. I took the best of my tools to the new warehouse. I sold all my lifts and bought a new one. I auctioned off all the rest. I am set to do anything at the new place as I did at Mile Hi.

The common denominator in my life is "Saab". Without Saab in my life, I am sure it would be different. Saab brings us all together as a huge family. Without Saab I would of not have met all of you wonderful people. I have friends in Canada, Sweden, Europe, all over the U.S. and the world. Without Saab I would not have met great

people like John Moss, Jack Lawrence, Bob Sinclair, Peter Bakstrom, Tom Donney, Larry Williams, Bill Jacobson... I apologize now for the ones I missed. Most people know me and again I apologize as I cannot remember hundreds of names. What would've happened if my father decided to work on Subarus or Volvos? I'm sure it wouldn't have been the same.

Snap your fingers and you are now 69. Time passes quickly. Now I know exactly how the opportunity my father gave to me turned out. It was never announced when I was 11. Saab has been extremely good to me. I want to pass it forward. My giving back to the Saab community will not end with the closing of Mile Hi Automotive. From the proceeds of the sale of the land owned by Mile Hi, I created the "Gerald L Danner Charitable Remainder Trust" to bypass capital gains taxes while I am alive. In my passing, the remainder will be passed on to the charity of my choice. The majority will go to "Our" Saab Heritage Museum in Sturgis. While I'm still alive, the gain on investments will allow me to give a very generous donation yearly till

I expire. Afterwards, the remainder goes to the museum. I encourage you to think about supporting the Saab Museum in your life plans. Saab is our most valuable common denominator. Saab has been very good to all of us. God bless Mom and Dad and the Saab family.

Sports Car Service in Wilmington, Delaware is moving to a smaller location. With well over 45 years of collecting Saab parts you can say we have accumulated a lot!
