

How it all began...

In February 2012, Tom Donney and Bill Jacobson purchased 10 cars from the GM Heritage collection. Both Tom and Bill already had a very nice collection of Saabs and with this acquisition came conversations like: "what's going to happen to our collections when we are no longer here?". Bill always dreamed of having a Saab Museum, and you could say that he does if you have ever been to his showroom at *Sports Car Service* in Wilmington, Delaware. Tom took it to the next level.

Tom and his wife, Patti started looking at properties in Iowa, Minnesota, Arizona, and as you know, they ended up in South Dakota. Why South Dakota? Tom had been traveling to the Black Hills since 2008 when he coached college football. They would rent a house and noticed that if they left one of their cars in storage, upon their return it would be in the same condition as when they left it. No rodents moved in, and there was no rust due to the low humidity. With ideal conditions for preserving cars, amazing roads through the Black Hills, and all the tourist attractions that the area has to offer, Sturgis, South Dakota was the right choice.

In May of 2017, they settled on the property and started moving cars. At first it was 5 cars at a time, 4 on a trailer and Patti driving one from Fort Dodge, Iowa to Sturgis,

South Dakota. One way, the trip is a 10 hour drive. With over 100 cars to move, Tom's good friend and longtime Saab enthusiast, Chuck Andrews, insisted that they purchase a 10 car hauler to speed things along and save on fuel. After getting the car hauler running (yes, Tom bought something that needed to be fixed, imagine that!) Chuck had the skills and the time to drive the new Saab hauler, so off he went with 10 cars at a time.

Tom then put the word out over social media asking for volunteers to help move cars which came to be known as the "Saab Stampede". The Saab hauler moved 110 Saabs and many more were driven by Tom, Patti, relatives, and Saab friends. The museum was finally ready for visitors after long days with volunteers helping, and hours spent on the phone trying to find contractors to repair the various things that needed to be done.

Just before the **2019** Saab Owners Convention in Loveland, Colorado, Tom had several "volunteer work days" where many Saab enthusiasts showed up and put in the necessary work. It ended with a museum kick off party and then a caravan of Saabs driving down US-85 excited to share their experiences at the museum with others at the Saab Owners Convention.









There were a few visitors to the Museum over the remaining summer months of 2019. The museum was only allowed to ask for donations for a tour. The "Official" opening was not until they received a permit from the City of Sturgis and opened to the public on June 16, 2020. As you can imagine, the summer of 2020 was quite slow. During the 2021 season the number of visitors definitely increased. This was still not enough to be self-supporting for the museum.

The museum has had many volunteers offering their time and skills. Tom and Patti, although they do a pretty amazing job, cannot physically do it all. After the work volunteers depart, they are left exhausted but also have an adrenaline rush to keep them moving forward. As a Saab enthusiast, please find the time to visit and volunteer. You too will leave exhausted but with a feeling of pride in helping to keep the Saab spirit alive.

The museum survives on financial support from various donations. **The Saab Heritage Car Museum USA** is a 501(c)(3) public charity, which makes your monetary donations tax deductible. Donations from social media campaigns have been successful and are always greatly appreciated. There are donors that have stepped up with large contributions and there are those that contribute monthly. Many have contributed material donations; some will be displayed at the museum and others will be sold to Saab enthusiasts for needed financial support. Any support, be it volunteering at the museum, sending money once a month, or even once a year is always greatly appreciated and will help the museum to keep the doors open for many years to come.





SAAB CLUB OF NORTH AMERICA "Ursaab", which translates to "original Saab" was Saab's first prototype automobile. Since the Swedish aircraft manufacturer Svenska Aeroplan Aktiebolaget (SAAB) expected significant production declines as a result of the end of World War II, various concepts were developed to keep the plant running at full capacity. Considerations were: motorcycle or vehicle construction, prefabricated houses, fitted kitchens, or ships with light metal hulls. "Projekt 92" came into being as a result. The goal was to build a small car to compete in the marketplace against manufacturers such as Volkswagen, Volvo, Opel, DKW, and others. A Saab had to be the right size, type, construction, and price - a small, affordable car. The vehicle had to be light, aerodynamic and offer space for four people. The target consumer price was 3200 SEK (equivalent to 366 USD).



Project 92, so-called as numbers 90 and 91 had already been assigned to civilian aircraft projects, was agreed to by Saab in 1945. The development took place under the technical direction of engineer Gunnar Ljungström; the body design came from industrial designer Sixten Sason. Of the 16 developers, only two — Ljungström and Rolf Mellde, who also acted as test driver — had a driver's license.

Extensive flow tests were carried out with a wooden model (scale 1:10) in the company's own wind tunnel. The "Ursaab" achieved a value of 0.32, which was extraordinarily good for the time. The streamlining was aircraft-like and was designed to reduce fuel consumption. The full size model was viewed with some reservations by Saab management, and in response engineer Gunnar Ljungström was noted to say: "...if it can save 100 litres of fuel a year, it doesn't matter if it looks like a frog."

The Ursaab had front-wheel drive and was propelled by a DKW two-cylinder, two-stroke engine (DKW was one of the four companies along with Horch, Wanderer, and Audi that formed Auto Union in 1932 and is hence an ancestor of the modern day Audi company). The engine had a displacement of



692 cm³ and developed 14 kW (18 hp) at 3500 rpm. Thanks to the good aerodynamics, the top speed was more than 110 km / h (68 mph!), around 20 km / h higher than that of an identically motorized DKW. With its self-supporting body and independent wheel suspension all around, the Ursaab had very modern design features. The choice of rear-hinged doors was made by Gunnar Ljungström as he wanted to lessen the risk of damaging doors while backing out of a garage.

The Ursaab was ready to drive by the end of summer 1946 and was immediately tested day and night. Prototype cars 92002 and 92003 were driven on every possible type of road surface and with the Ursaab (92001) clocked over 329,327 miles - equivalent to 13 journeys around the world. 92002 was presented to the Swedish press on June 15, 1947 at the Linköping headquarters next to the Ursaab, which at that time had covered around 31,000 miles on test drives. Another two years passed between the presentation of the prototypes and the start of series production of the Saab 92.



A curious feature of the Ursaab was the hood emblem. This was the first emblem to appear on a Saab automobile. The symbol itself was nothing more than a fictitious heraldic symbol which did not appear on any Saab since. The characters on the badge have no meaning, but It is an iconic symbol which is a reminder of how and where Saab automobiles came from.

The Saab Club of North America features this iconic symbol as its logo for the **Saab Owners Convention 2022**. The backdrop of the **Saab Heritage Car Museum USA** and this iconic symbol serves to remind us of Saab's humble beginnings.

Concours d'Saab Award:

A Judged/Scored event scored by trained judges.

- Based on the ideal of presenting the Best of the Best
- Highlights the original design and construction specifications
- Criteria will be used in judging both original and restored examples
- Equal weight to originality and condition
- Higher-scoring cars and award winners are those that are closest to the way they left the factory
- You can enter one competition or the other, not both

Concours d'Saab is based on presenting the "Best of the Best". Our goal is to assemble these Saabs in an arena of competition which highlights their originality and condition. The SCNA Concours d'Saab rules are designed to give equal weight to originality and condition. Higher scoring cars and award winners are closest to the way that they left the factory. Concours d'Saab provides a great opportunity to "show and tell", and since Saabs are no longer produced, any year or model is eligible for entry into the Concours d'Saab voting.

What to expect when you enter the Concours d'Saab:

The **Concours d'Saab** is a judged/scored event. The judges have many years of experience with Saabs. **A winning Saab is a clean Saab!** Things like detailed door jambs, trunk, and engine bay will improve your "condition" scores. All personal/cargo items should be removed from the car leaving the trunk and interior empty and easily viewed. The judges need access to all parts of the car: engine bay, trunk, spare tire, glove box, etc. Major modifications will result in reduced originality scores. Your judging sheet will be returned to you after the show with the judges' suggestions as to improvements you might make for next year!





SPECIAL AWARDS



This memorial award is named for Saab enthusiast Larry Williams, fondly known as "Stroker". Larry, his wife Katha, and Sadie (his '63 bullnose Saab 96) were a fixture every year at SOC. Larry's passion for Saab was contagious and he loved sharing it with anyone that would listen. This award is presented by the SCNA Board of Directors to the Saab enthusiast that best exemplifies that same spirit annually at the owners convention.

2021 Spirit of Saab Award recipient: **ED LORENZ**



This memorial award was created in 2011 in honor of "Uncle Bob" Sinclair, former CEO of Saab-Scania of America. Bob Sinclair was instrumental in raising the profile of the Saab brand in the United States in the '80s and early '90s. Bob Sinclair is most famous for insisting that Saab offer more high-end and performance options in the classic 900 as well as developing the first Saab convertible to better appeal to the American market. The 900 convertible became a sensation with over a quarter million sold over the next 10 years. This award is presented by the SCNA Board of Directors annually to the best SPG or convertible in attendance at the owners convention.

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WALTER KERN AWARD

Walter Kern is best known in Saab circles as the man who created the Saab Quantum. Walter was actually an MIT-trained nuclear physicist who loved amateur racing. He designed and built the first Quantum in his spare time while employed at IBM as an engineer and caught the attention of Saab in the early 1960s. Sadly none of the Quantum models ever made it into mass production but Walter remains a legend amongst Saab devotees. The Walter Kern Award was created by the **Vintage Saab Club of North America** and is awarded to the person who best exemplifies the innovation and creativity that Walter Kern exemplified in his endeavors.

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SAAB CLUB OF NORTH AMERICA Welcome to Sturgis, a city in South Dakota that resembles a small town in many other parts of the country. With a year round population of less than 8,000, the winters can feel long and quiet, but the short summer season is quite the opposite. July is very likely the best time to explore the area, with a few less tourists, mild weather and businesses and attractions open and ready to offer you an enjoyable and memorable experience. Without a doubt, there is something to pique the interest of friends and family members alike, making this significant SOC even more unique and special. Every Saab can find an ideal road nearby, with speed limits of 75 on the interstate, and undulating mountain roads that are perfect for spirited, third and fourth gear driving at a safe and pleasant speed.

The drive from the museum up to Deadwood, where Wild Bill and Calamity Jane have their final resting place, is a beautiful, 20 minute ride via the main road, but I strongly recommend taking "the long way" at least once during your visit. It does add about 20 minutes to your drive, but it is my personal preferred route. From Dickson Drive, simply take a right onto Junction Rd, which quickly turns into Vanocker Canyon Rd. You will pass the Belle Joli Winery and then Wonderland Cave as you continue through the beautiful canyon towards the little village of Nemo. At the stop sign, take a right onto Nemo Rd and you come to Highway 385 and onto 85. The roads are well paved and well marked, and this will bring you into Deadwood from the other side of

town, allowing you to see the downtown area before heading to the Lodge for Friday and Saturday dinner. This is just one of many routes that will exercise your Saab while giving you a taste of the area.

The Black Hills get their English name from their native Lakota language name and because this dark, tree covered plateau can be seen from a distance on the surrounding prairie. It is a beautiful part of the country; home to many unique geographical regions, natural and artist inspiring beauty, historic towns and famous locations from American history and folklore. While the convention runs Thursday through Sunday, it would be wise to try to stay as long as you can in order to explore the area. In addition to Mt. Rushmore and the Black Hills National Forest, there are multiple National and State Parks nearby like the Badlands with its moon-like terrain and Devil's Tower, a 1,200 foot rock



that rises like a small, flat-topped mountain out of the prairie.

If you are interested in caves, you will find two National Parks where you can explore some

of the world's most fascinating, intricate and beautiful caves at the Jewel Cave National Monument or Wind Cave National Park. These parks, along with Custer State Park near Sturgis, offer a combination of walks, longer hikes and drives to match your ability and desire. Those interested in mountain biking, swimming or rock climbing can also find plenty of options around the Black Hills and nearby Spearfish Canyon. If you are traveling with someone who likes dinosaurs and fossils, you can visit the Mammoth Site, a privately owned and still active archaeological site. There are also local sites geared specifically for kids like the Reptile Garden outside of Rapid City or the Broken Boot or Big Thunder Gold Mine, recreated gold mines where kids can learn about and even try mining for gold.

Perhaps you are interested in military or aviation history. Just outside of Rapid City, there is the South Dakota Air & Space Museum located on Ellsworth Air Force Base, offering free admission and boasting over 30 aircraft located both indoor and outside. There was even a secret missile site hidden under the South Dakota

plains, and you can now visit the Minuteman Missile National Historic Site located east of the Badlands site along Interstate 90. These and many of the sites offer tours but in some cases reservations are required and certain time slots may fill up quickly. Try to determine which activities you wish to do and what sites you are most interested in visiting so that you can plan your visit. Distances can look small on a map, but it is important to try to plan out your itinerary while leaving yourself time to relax and truly experience the array of adventures that the area has to offer.



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For those who know me, you know that I am 100% a Saab enthusiast. Having been around Saabs since age 11, and now at 68, I decided to retire. Mile Hi Automotive had been my only job for 57 years. In 1964 my father gave me the opportunity to work at his body shop. Saab Southwest, which was the regional distribution center for the western USA opened that year in Denver. My Dad met Dick Catron (the first Saab dealer in Denver), introduced himself, and mentioned that he had an auto body shop. He asked Dick if he needed someone to repair the transportation damaged new Saabs that were arriving. Dick gave Dad two '64 bull nose Saabs to work on; they were repaired and returned, making Dick very happy. This is where the marriage with Saab started.

I always had mechanical abilities. I learned to weld when I was 11, and at 15 I rebuilt my first V-8 engine in a 1968 GTO. I graduated high school in 1971 and got married in 1974. I was truly dedicated to my Dad's shop, and in 1978 he made me the president of Mile Hi Body **Shop** at only 25 years old. In 1982 I purchased ½ city block in downtown Denver and relocated from our small shop. With the success of Saab in the 80's & 90's, Mile Hi was thriving. At the peak, I had 17 employees exclusively servicing Saabs. The new location allowed us to expand our business with a Saab service center, a Saab salvage yard with over 100+ rust free Saabs, a collision center, and a used car dealership.

I never wrote a payroll, receivable, or payable check in the 52 years of **Mile Hi**. I was very clear about my talents; I am not a bookkeeper, I am a mechanic. My Ex-wife Marla was the best business partner that I ever had. When we got started, she always took care of the front-end details. She was good! I was where I needed to be, in the back ensuring mechanical quality. Marla left in 2001, and after that I had the means to

afford office management. My Daughter Michelle has been a blessing to me, stepping in to support me until I closed. *Mile Hi* had always been a hobby shop to me. I do not recall a day in 52 years where I thought "I really do not want to be here today!" If you enjoy your job, it is not work. Even to the last days, it was fun. I had great employees and especially great customers. I had 50+ years of dedication to my customers. I got to see them grow in their careers, and they got to see me grow as well.



Saab became an orphan car brand after the bankruptcy in 2011. Saab was done! Parts are what keep Saab strong to this day. Looking back, I was able to participate in the best lifecycle of any car manufacturer. I have worked on every model Saab

from the 92 to the 9-4, and all models in between. I have met Saab royalty, business owners and many remarkable individuals along the way.

I created the Gerald L Danner Charitable Remainder **Trust** to bypass capital gains when I sold my property. I directed the benefits to support the Saab Heritage Car Museum USA upon my passing. I will be contributing yearly until that day.

Saab has been extremely good to me. Like all of us Saab business owners, we are getting older, and we have lost many. For the years that I still have left I will continue to be a Saab enthusiast. Consider supporting the museum. After all, we are all here because of our love for Saab.
